Currently I am soliciting contributions for the Fall, 2006 edition of So*cial Problems Forum: The SSSP Newsletter*. Having successfully completed three issues with the superb assistance of editorial assistant Virginia Ellen, I will be looking for a new editorial assistant to begin working with me for the Fall issue. As per the recommendation of members of the publications committee, we have instituted a "News of Note" feature in our first three issues, and we will continue running installments of this feature in each future issue. In the second issue we inaugurated the first installment of a regular column devoted to the needs and concerns of graduate students and of junior faculty seeking tenure and promotion. The first two installments featured excerpts from an extended interview with Anne L. Schneider, former Dean of the College of Public Programs at Arizona State University.

As soon as this is finalized I will inform Michele Koontz and the Publications Committee.

I would like to thank everyone who contributed material to the Newsletter this year. I am grateful for the support offered by Michele Koontz and Tom Hood, and I am especially grateful for the assistance and expertise offered by Virginia Ellen as she served as editorial assistant. Also, I am indebted to Steve Couch who made the transition painless, and to the Publications Committee for allowing me the opportunity to serve as editor. Many thanks to each of you.

Following in the footsteps of Steve Couch's tenure, I have been actively soliciting guest coordinators for new "Perspectives on Social Problems." Also, I have been contacting past SSSP presidents to solicit essays for the "Past Presidential Essay" essays that Steve initiated, and will publish future essays in that series as I can. In addition, I have secured commitments from a number of members to provide book reviews to appear in future issues, and I have material to include in the next few editions of the junior faculty and graduate student column.

I will continue to actively solicit contributions for these features as well as commentaries, letters to the editor, and the like. I welcome suggestions and comments from members of the Publications Committee, and I am grateful for the honor the committee has afforded me.
