
The survey ran for two weeks from August 23 through September 12 with a 23% participation rate.


Text Entry

Text Entry

It's just spurious and a waste of paper. The web app is far more useful.

I think the benefit of a printed program is minimal compared to the impact on resources (time, money, natural resources). If people want to print from the website, they should have that option, but I do not think we need to provide them. I found it a little challenging to do searches and plan for attendance


It was difficult to navigate and did not appear great on my mobile device


Based on your experience, how satisfied are you with the following?


Did you pre-register for the Annual Meeting?


Why does it cost so much money? Grad student\$ are poor.


Was the <u>on-site</u> registration process satisfactory?


How many sessions did you participate in at the Annual Meeting? (Participate is defined as having a specific role such organizer, presenter, etc.)



You said that you are dissatisfied with some aspect of the session(s) you attended. Please tell us why you are dissatisfied.

Text Entry

I was disappointed in the lack of attendance for the session that I presented at. I presented in the session on homelessness. I was so excited to present in a homeless research specific session but was disappointed by the lack of attendance. I was hoping it would be a better opportunity for networking with people who had a similar interest.

Aside from the presenters, there were maybe 4 people in attendance. All presenters aside from one were graduate students, so there were clear holes in the research materials. The organization has become very grad student heavy. Grad students are very important members and it is good that SSSP is welcoming. However, nearly 100% of the presentations I attended were grad students. We need a better balance of senior scholars.

Attendance was low. One of my panels had only 2 audience members.

There was not enough time for Q&A at the end of all the presentations.

Poor scholarship, disorganized presenters, unprepared

Papers should have a beginning, middle, and end. Conferences are not places to throw out raw data with no analysis. Presentations can be tentative, but they must indicate how the material is situated in existing literature and how it might advance our thinking. The over-professionalization of graduate students has led to conference sessions that feel like first-year seminars.

There were very few people in the audience in both sessions I attended. In the session I presented in, there were 5 panelists and only three audience members, none of whom asked any questions or made any comments. Our facilitator was excellent, and those of us presenting sat in the audience for the other presenters, but we were disappointed in the turn out. It felt more like a round-table than a presentation.

Text Entry

The research presented felt very low-quality and pretty johnny one-note.

Questions / discussions could be better but I attribute that to audience more so than the presenters

Low attendance

There was an unevenness to the presentations. Some presentations were highly polished and I was able to learn some exciting new information. Other presentations rambled giving the impression that presenters didn't take this opportunity to share work seriously.

A/V provided by the venue could have been more accommodating/but overall very good adaptability by panelists.

I think the session presentations are often just presenters reading huge chunks of block text from slides. Not engaging at all, and shows a lack of preparation and enthusiasm about one's project.

My presentation was on Sunday so the energy was probably lower overall on the last day. But it was annoying to find that my presider and one of the three presenters arrived 5 minutes late. They generally did not seem very prepared and not invested in the presentations and following discussions. It was somewhat disheartening because me and the other presenter had prepared slides and rehearsed for what was a pretty unenthusiastic group.

The discussant for my session did not wait for me to answer one of the questions asked to me during the discussion after the presentations; I felt that she did not agree with the findings of my research because she did not understand my methodology, and therefore did not take my presentation as seriously as the others.

No audience participation

I was disappointed with the quality of presentations at both my own sessions and those I attended without presenting. I haven't felt like this in the past but this year was disappointed and it made me wonder if I will attend SSSP anymore.

Text Entry

I had a good time but I feel that the hotel was not conducive to an overall great conference experience. The hotel was very old and dark and did not have a social atmosphere. I also would have liked to network more but when I attended events everyone was, of course, with their friends and people they already know. I feel that this could have been easier if we were in a nicer, or more modern space. Further, I presented in a session that only had 1 audience member. I am concerned that people register for SSSP and then just leave and go to ASA or use it as a vacation. I don't know what SSSP can do to combat that, but it is frustrating to prepare for a session and have only 1 attendee in addition to the panel and organizer.

None of the presenters or conference activities, except those in the session I organized, had handouts of their powerpoint slides or any large-print materials. Access needs during presentations were very poor.

Low attendance. No specific feedback re: the specific area of my interest

They were not entirely inclusive for persons with disabilities. Further, the room for one disability session was completely overcrowded, which was not conducive for persons who had equipment or aids. .. I wish that every session had a discussant so that I could get feedback on my project.


Some presenters literally read their papers. I would suggest encouraging presenters to make eye contact with their audiences.

Some of the presentations were rather weak

The critical dialogue sessions were not moderated very well. There was a lack of interesting dialogue and I would have liked to hear more about each paper before jumping into discussion.

Text Entry

Okay - but there was no "greeting" - just providing name, getting tag.

Hosting the awards in the same room as the division reception might help improve attendance / awareness of awards. A poster, banner, or other photographic representation of winners might help better recognize achievements of those who cannot be recognized in a larger/meeting setting.

There was mention of a graduate student happy hour, but no indication of its location. No one I talked to knew about it.

My SSSP mentor was mean and unsupportive.

I feel that food should be provided for the Thursday and Friday receptions in addition to the division sponsored reception on Saturday. I had fun networking but was starving at the end and unable to find dinner on my own due to it being so late

There was no help or representation from SSSP. it did not feel inclusive, very clique, what is this - ASA? Even ISA was more organized, more inclusive. It was overall a real disappointment this yr. Also, the sessions were so poorly attended. I spent a lot of time preparing a talk for only a handful of people and this was one of the more well-attended sessions. Some had only the panel in the audience!





Accommodations are the biggest barrier to my attending events. I would so much appreciate the SSSP setting up a system to connect people to share rooms. I could not book a flight until I knew I had someplace to stay. Refillable water bottle stations—please. It would be wonderful to have a sponsor of reusable water bottles. The number of water bottles going into the garbage was uncomfortable. Recycling and composting bins Poster presentations: have people put up their research posters along the main registration area walls (and have a place for handouts). Leave the posters up for the entire conference so people can peruse them at their leisure. Maybe have a dedicated time for poster presenters to be there to talk about their research. ASA had a poster presentation but you had to mount posters on foam core, which is outdated, expensive, and impossible to transport. If people had their posters printed on retractable bands then tacking them onto walls would not be an issue. What are the ways SSSP can create fundraising opps for students and profs who are cash strapped so they can attend? If conferences are only for those with money then ... it seems contrary to SSSP's mission and values. Book vendors: increase the number of vendors. I worked for a publisher at the ASA conference and met many vendors who did not know about SSSP Membership recruiters: I talked to many students and profs who did not know about SSSP. I think I was able to recruit a few new members. How can SSSP help people like me, who is now a firm believer in SSSP, talk to people about membership?
