I am writing on behalf of the Society for the Study of Social Problems (SSSP), one of the oldest and most respected social science organizations in the country, to express our condolences for your loss. The loss of Representative John R. Lewis saddens us deeply, but we recognize that the loss for you and his family is so much more personal and painful. We want to take this opportunity to thank you, and his family, for all you and they have done to support and help him do the essential work to which he dedicated his life, and to assure you that we, collectively and individually, will do what we can to protect the many wonderful things he helped to achieve and to fashion a more just and equal society.

Attached is a statement in the form of a resolution adopted by our Board of Directors upon learning of Representative Lewis's passing. Attached as well are copies of letters we have sent to the President of the United States, Congressional leaders, and the Governor of Alabama and their legislative leaders in support of renaming the Edmund Pettus Bridge the John R. Lewis Bridge, replacing the statue of Alexander Hamilton Stephens in the Capitol with a statue of Representative Lewis, and the expansion of voting rights and reforms in the criminal justice system, including policing reforms.

Please convey our condolences to Representative Lewis's family for us and feel free to share with them the attached. If you can think of ways that we as a professional academic and social justice organization can help you to advance the late representative's civil rights and social justice agenda, please let us know.
